And, finally to you. Without your help and support I would not be here. Special thanks to the Junior Referees. You are a great source of satisfaction to me personally.


My sincere thanks to my wife, Dymphy. Without her help and support I would be unable to do the job.

Bill Lalor, Patron, the elder statesman, thank you for your guidance and support.


To Michael Quailey and John Quinn, thank you for your friendship, your unselfish support.

GRADE REFEREES REPORT

Before we start to list the individual achievements of our Graded Members, let us first say that the whole Association is proud of your efforts and appointments in 1992 and our congratulations go to each and every one of you.

Firstly, North Sydney's representation in Grade increased this year when Martin Ryan was added to the list as a Touch Judge. Martin's achievement is a fine example of perseverance and dedication paying off. After learning the ropes on President's Cup lines this year, bigger and better things await him.

Steve Clark set North Sydney milestone when he achieved (and earned) promotion to First Grade centres. For the history buffs, Steve was the first home grown North Sydney Referee to run a First Grade centre since Brian Barry in 1967. 25 years is certainly a long time between drinks. After his experiences in the heat of the First Grade caldron, the question which is most asked of Steve is "Where's Wally Now?" To cap off a wonderful season, Steve was appointed to the centre of the Metropolitan Cup First Grade Grand Final.

Mr Evergreen(grey), Steve Betts, had a wonderful year when he achieved the ultimate appointment in Rugby League - an Australia V Great Britain Test Match. One would think that this would be sufficient for one year but not for Steve, he performed well through out the season and earned the appointment to the First Grade Grand Final. Steve efforts show that there are goals and rewards for Touch Judging.

Like a good bottle of Glen-Fiddich, Colin Jones keeps getting better with age and he had a solid year on First Grade lines which resulted in him being appointed to Reserve Grade Semi-Finals and to the President's Cup Grand Final.

Jim Neal had `one of those years', but we did see him quite often on First Grade lines and later in the season, as an In-goal Touch Judge. We don't need to elaborate on his end of year experience suffice to say that all our members would agree that a certain media commentator should try to do the job before condemning a man to a swim in the "Wollongong Ocean" (sic), otherwise he should take the swim himself.

Robert Kiddle was also often seen on First Grade lines and he was rewarded for his efforts with appointments to the President's Cup Semi-Finals. His performances showed that the step into the representative arena cannot be too far away.

It be remiss if it was not mentioned that Vince Smith retired from Grade at the start of the year. Vince had long and distinguished Grade career which included many appointments to the Grade Semi-Finals, Finals and Grand Finals. He was also appointed to a number of State of Origin games and two Australia V Great Britain Test Match lines. Vince's services will be missed in Grade and we wish him the best for his retirement.

To all our Graded Members, our good wishes are with you for 1993 and keep the North Sydney flag flying high.

JUNIOR LEAGUE REPORT

Another long and tiring season would perhaps best sum up 1992. As usual, trials started in February and with Junior Representative trails concluding the season in October, the stamina of even the hardiest referee was tested.

On the whole, 1992 was blessed with good weather. Only one weekend was lost due to rain and this meant that the competition ran fairly smoothly. Mid-week night matches were required for the Under 19 and A Reserve competitions as these grades had more teams than the A Grade. This meant some rather cold nights for those members who were appointed however, the main concern was finding grounds with adequate lighting. A few of the grounds used just did not have enough candle-power to stage these matches in safety. Things are not right when Touch Judges cannot see the far touch lines and the Junior League must address this aspect should the need to hold night games arise in the future. After all, it is the players who are a risk but if an incident goes undetected, it is the Referee and Touch Judges who cop the flak.

The season officially began as it did in 1991, with a Sevens Tournament. This year, it was a little disappointing as some of the clubs did not support it as the should have. Those who turned up, including our Referees, had an enjoyable day.

It was pleasing to see that the number of teams in the Mini/Mod age groups were high. This bears testimony to the hard work done by the District Club's Development Officers, namely Kelly Egan and Craig Wilson and their boss Kevin Nicholls. Greg Florimo has been added to this already impressive list for 1993 to aid in the recruitment of players.

Unfortunately, numbers were lacking in the vital ages of Under 15 to Under 17. Things were so bad that we only had one Under 17 team and they spent the season playing in Manly. A shortage of teams in these age groups is not good as they are a vital stage in a referee's development. For 1993, the under 16 competition has been merged with the Under 17. Whether this action will see an increase in numbers and an improvement in the standard of football is not known but it is hoped that this will be the result.

Our Grand Final days were played at North Sydney Oval and in good weather. Both days were highly enjoyable and entertaining football was played by all teams. Our congratulations are extended to the Clubs which enjoyed premiership success.

1992 saw the appointment of a full-time Junior League Administrator, namely Paul Heptonstall. Paul was on a learning curve for most of the year but he carried out his tasks well and he was always ready to listen to any problem we might have had. Thanks Paul. Our thanks also go to the Junior League Executive, namely Brian Marsden, John Quinn, Jim Brannigan and Lyn Faulkner for their help and assistance.

To all clubs who looked after our members when visiting their grounds, thank you. 1992 saw a new level of co-operation when some of our members were seen working in Club canteens on Saturdays. The word is that they will be invited back as profits were up!




