



Secretary's Report

Gentlemen, 1982 has finished. This was our Jubilee Year and it showed how an Association is bound together through the common reason of making a success of this year. Speaking from the Executive side, we knew of the numerous meetings that went on, the disagreements, the arguments, the research, the heated discussions, the worries and then the arbitrary meeting with President John. This all showed the dedication by these people and I am sure it was appreciated by all concerned. It was a great success.

The year started as usual with our Chief Trainer, Alex Soane, at Lofberg Oval. Although numbers varied on each night, the ones there, I am sure, benefited from these training runs. Our special thanks again to Alex Soane for his work.

This eventually promoted a Motion during the year to refuse to referee on grounds noted for trouble if ropes weren't provided and erected. This is a problem we will be looking at very closely in 1983, and we will be seeking a further meeting with the District Club early in 1983.

The District Club Appeals Board again gave the Junior League Judiciary Committee and the Referees no support, as usual, by reducing penalties on persons found guilty to almost, and sometimes nothing. This again is a worrying point, especially for a new and young referee.

Guest speakers this year were Ray O'Donnell, John O'Sullivan, Barry Cross, Frank Walsh and Don McDonald.

We had a special guest in Fred Lindop and his son, who gave a very informative and interesting talk on the life of a referee in England. What a personality this fellow has. We also had the French referee, Robert Fasollette at our meeting.

This year saw the Junior League put the M Grade to D Reserve Grade Grand Finals on one day at North Sydney Oval - 9 a.m. to 10.30 p.m. It was a very long day, but a success as far as the Junior League was concerned and it was a good promotion.

Another Seminar was held at Headon Park on a Saturda fternoon. It was well attended and a lot of interesting ints were aired. President John, Colin Jones and Erle Carroll were speakers.

The Dangar Island Weekend Seminar proved a success again, with Jack Jewel at his best, giving a talk on what is expected of referees today and important points to watch in 1983. It was a great success. The companionship which developed among our young referees was good to see. The spiritual side of life was not overlooked as Reverend Terry Bell held a special Mass for those who wished to attend.

To our fishing expert, Jim Worrell, and boat expert, Fred Theuarjahr, our special thanks. Also thanks to Robert Kiddle, Chris Hopkins and Denis Habermann for their work, and to T.N.T., the N.S.W. Referees sponsors, for their financial support, and the North Sydney Leagues Club for the use of the houses on Dangar Island.

With the introduction of new rules in 1983; new ideas on running the Junior League; new first grade coach for our District Club, we look forward to an exhilarating season.

This year again saw our victorious Golf team carry off the major Trophy. Our team was lead by Dave Field and that's the third win in a row. I have no doubt we can make it four.

To my wife, Dymphy, who again makes my job a lot easier. I look forward to seeing you all in 1983.









This evening proved to an overwhelming success, even considering those people who tried to find fault for their own gratification.


The Children's Christmas Party again was a good day for those who attended, especially the kids and Santa. A special thanks must go to the bearded fellow.


