

SECRETARY'S REPORT

It gives me great pleasure to present to you the 1988 Annual Report, my first as Secretary of your Association. 1988 proved to be a year in which North Sydney excelled in some areas but fell down in others, but overall a year in which North Sydney Referees left its mark on the game of Rugby League.

One of the disappointing aspects of the year was the attendance, or the lack of it, by our Active Senior members at meetings and the Annual Ladies Night. Attendance at meetings is something that is stressed to us from the moment we join the Association. Only 5 of our 22 Senior Active members had full attendance (including approved absences). For the Association to function properly, higher attendances are required. Attendance at our Ladies Night was better, but below what Committee would have liked. These two areas must be improved if the Association is to grow and prosper in the coming years and it is quite an easy problem to rectify.

At the start of the year we lost two of our Senior Members, Wayne McGhee to South Sydney and Joanne Lyons to Canberra. Their services were to be missed and we wish them well in their new Districts. Two able replacements were found to compensate for this loss. Colin Felsman joined us from Group 3, while an old friend, Neville Warner made a comeback after a few years of "retirement". A big welcome to Colin and welcome back to Neville.

During the season we were fortunate to host Francis Desplas, the visiting French Referee for the Test Matches. With the co-operation of the Junior League, he was appointed to fixtures at Howson Oval. Following the days activities we treated Francis, his wife Christriane and their interpreter Jerome Cavalli (who is a member of the Victorian Referees) to dinner at Hornsby RSL. Our thanks are extended to NSW Referees for affording us the opportunity to look after Francis, the Junior League for allowing him to be appointed, the West Pymble Club for their hospitality at the ground and to Hornsby RSL for their good service and hospitality in the evening.

There were two important functions held during the season at which I had pleasure in representing the Association. The first was a special Mass held to celebrate Father Bell's 25 years in the Priesthood. A great achievement and we trust that the next 25 years are as good as the first. The second was a special luncheon put on by members of the District Club. These luncheons are held every 2 months during the season to say thank you to people who give so much to the North Sydney cause. The one that I attended was in honour of John Quinn. John's efforts to North Sydney have been well documented and his Life Membership of the 3 footballing bodies in the District, (our Association, the Junior League and the District Club) are testimony to his years of tireless work for North Sydney and Rugby League. Sometimes I think we take John a little bit for granted as he is always there to help, whether it be with refereeing, administration or other things. This luncheon was a fitting tribute to a man who has given so much to the great game of Rugby League.

Abuse of Referees is an never ending problem. Criticism of our on field performances, if put forward in the correct manner, is not something to be frowned upon, but something we can use to improve ourselves, however the vile and gutter language together with the gross personal insults, sometimes even aimed at our women folk is not only hurtful to us, but to the game of Rugby League and is the greatest barrier that we face for the recruitment of new members. People have better things to do with their time than to run up and down a football field and be abused. I don't know what can be done to rectify this problem but it needs the urgent attention of all involved with the game.

Secretary is not a job in which you learn everything immediately. You are constantly learning and seeking advice. Unfortunately some mistakes are made. To those who were affected by these errors, I apologise. To my fellow Committee Members, thank you for your help and support. To Brian Barry, John Boyle and Brian Minnett, our past Secretaries, my thanks for your help and guidance. Your advice made my job a lot easier.

Finally my thanks to two ladies, Gaye Bowden at work, for answering all those phone calls and typing the majority of the Associations correspondence, and my Mother for taking all those messages at home and putting up with a lot more. Without their help and support I could not have carried out my duties nor could the Association have met its commitments.

Now is the time to put the problems of the past behind us, pull together as a team and strive to improve ourselves and the Association in 1989.

JUNIOR LEAGUE REPORT

The 1988 season presented new challenges in this area to both our Association and the Junior League. With the A/Reserve Grade in its third season, the problems of the previous two years were resolved which resulted in the smooth running of this competition.

After two years of ground work, the Junior League finally became an incorporated body, a milestone achievement as it is the first Junior League body in Sydney to do so. All involved with this work are to be congratulated, especially John Hickey. With the Junior League taking this step, all of the clubs are now becoming incorporated themselves.

This season was the first with the new Judiciary arrangements. While not downgrading the previous Chairman and Committee, the formula of the new body (based on the NSWRL model) was an improvement and although there were a few problems, most of them were sorted out and we expect 1989 to be trouble free as far as the Judiciary is concerned. Our thanks are extended to Chairman John McKinn, our representatives Brian Barry and John Byrne and the Junior League representatives Ron Carey and Fred Thompson, especially when a Junior Member was required to attend.

On the playing fields, team numbers were down for weekend games and up for the mid-week school competition. The drop off in weekend teams is of particular concern and to this end a Promotion and Recruitment Committee was formed to reverse the trend. For this Committee to be successful, it requires positive input from all its members, including our own and the early signs are that this will be the case. Lets hope that they can get more teams on the field in 1989, especially in the Mini/Mod age groups.

Our three Grand Final days were successful with close matches and entertaining football being applicable to most age groups. Special mention should be made of the Premiers in the three senior grades:

- * McMahons Pt on winning the A Grade from 5th position
- * Crows Nest A/Reserve Grade for winning the Clubs first premiership in 15 years
- * Pennant Hills Under 19s for going through the season undefeated.

Our congratulations are extended to these and all other premiership winning teams.

On the Senior Grand Final day, our Touch Football team once again took to the field against the Junior League "Living Legends", to defend the title we won last year. I am not one to criticise Referees, but the Referee for the match, chosen by the "Living Legends", was obviously motivated in their dressing room (as his decisions were to prove with a 2-15 penalty count in only 20 min of football). Despite playing brilliantly our boys were beaten 3-2 with the winning try coming after the full time bell when the Referee chimed into their backline and gave the final pass for the match winner. However a great time was had by all and we look forward to next years match. A video of the game was taken and it will be made available for screening at a meeting early next year.

Already, two major changes have been made for 1989. The first involves Players Registration details which are currently being put onto computer. The second is the vacating of North Sydney Oval for the end of season games. In future all of these games (Semi Finals, Finals and Grand Finals) for all age groups will be played at Macquarie University. This move was not taken lightly but with the exorbitant rent that is now being charged by North Sydney Council and the limited availability of the Oval, the move was inevitable.

Finally, our thanks are extended to the Board of Management of the Junior League for their help and Co-operation during the year, especially John Quinn and John Hickey who were always available to sort out any problems.

JUNIOR REPRESENTATIVE REFEREES REPORT

Despite the reduced competition, with the Presidents Cup going to grade, the 1988 Representative season was highly successful for North Sydney.

Steve Clark and John Melville ran Flegg Cup centres throughout the entire competition and were rewarded with Semi Final appointments for their efforts, Steve in the Flegg Cup and John in the Ball Cup with Steve going on to referee the S.G Ball Cup Final.









JUNIOR REFEREES REPORT

At the end of each season, it is time to look back on what we have achieved over the past year. For the members of our Junior Ranks, they too will look back and assess their performances.

On the whole, our Juniors have done themselves and the Association proud. It is not easy to spend each weekend as a Referee, yet few complaints were received. All achieved success on the field and many were called to officiate in games normally beyond what could be expected from a Junior Referee, yet no real problems were encountered.

It is interesting to note that the majority of our Junior Members will go out at a moments notice, that they will travel to the four corners of North Sydney District, that they can generally be relied upon to fill in when a Senior has withdrawn and that they conduct themselves in a professional manner, all without complaint! It is this attitude that is to be commended and encouraged and one that perhaps we could all take a few lessons from.

It is true that on occasions some of our Juniors have "walked" lines, had dirty boots and arrived at their games with little time to spare but it is also true that they do not learn these habits of their own accord. The medallions were presented by our President, Steve Betts while Steve's was presented by our Senior Vice President, Vince Smith.







COACHING CO-ORDINATORS' REPORT





FRANK HYDE SINGS


The year commenced with our Past And Present Night in March; our first for six years. We were fortunate to have a dozen of our Life Members with us and each received a special presentation.


