

PATRONS REPORT

Gentlemen,

It is with pleasure that I be requested to add a few words to the Association's Annual Report.

As it usual, we can always look back on a season just completed to determine in retrospect whether we have achieved the measure of success we had hoped for or not, both as an Association and as individual members of it.

As far as the Association is concerned, its Administrative affairs were conducted in the usual efficient manner by the Executive Committee and Social Secretary and in this they were ably supported by our Delegates to the Junior League, Schoolboys, and the Head Body. To all concerned, I extend my congratulations on a successful year.

The success or otherwise of a season's activities from the point of view of each member is one that only he can judge. Every referee endeavours to ensure that in his career he achieves at least some of the goals he sets for himself. When he passes the oral examination, he joins his local district association with the hope that he will progress in its ranks. Most set for themselves the aim of reaching grade status. This is an honour which is difficult to obtain, particularly when one considers the large number offering compared with the small number required. Further avenues of success are available to him only if he is prepared to continue to keep himself conversant with the Laws of the Game and to keep in good physical condition. These are two most important factors. He should not become complacent with his initial success, but should, by his continued thirst for knowledge, demonstrate to all that he has not only qualifications for the status he has achieved, but the qualifications to go further.

It was indeed an honour to have present at a meeting during the season, English International referee Bill Thompson, who impressed all by his obvious sincerity and cheerful personality. The exchange of visits between referees of the countries of the Rugby League world is most desirable.

Finally, I would extend congratulations to all who achieved various honours during the 1977 season and may I express the wish that season 1978 will be a most progressive one for Rugby League, and in particular for all members of our Association.

PRESIDENTS REPORT

The year 1977 was our 55th year of operation - five years to go before we reach another milestone, our Diamond Jubilee - the years pass very quickly so spare a thought for 1982.

The Season 1977 did not commence too well for the Association, and, due to the demands of the District Club through their lack of finance, we did not look like getting our season under way. Eventually, after many tiresome and long meetings, we did get off the ground a week or so late and for most of the games during the season, we were able to supply referees to the Junior League and Schoolboys. A point that worried me in 1977 was that we had only one new Schoolboy Referee - not a good thing for the future. Our Senior Ranks were swelled by one new member and this was soon cancelled out when we lost two seniors after incidents in Junior League games, and one referee through injury in July, 1977.

A pleasing feature of the season was that three Schoolboys referees, namely G. Bellew, J. Boyle and G. Field all obtained their Senior Badge at their first application in October and the same three were successful in their High School and Technical Exams in 1977.

My thanks go out to the Executive of the North Sydney Leagues Club, District Football Club, Executive of the Junior League and Schoolboys Association and to the Executive and players of all Junior League and Schoolboys Clubs for their help and good fellowship during 1977.

Our financial position for the year makes good reading - at times I did not think that we were going to be square with the card, but our thanks for this position must go to Peter Punch, our Social Secretary, Ron Hammond for his astute buying, and to Geoff McManus for his control of the purse strings.

Socially, Peter Punch served up many functions including successful nights at Epping R.S.L., Willoughby Legion, our Past & Present evening, Ladies night at Pennant Hills, a very successful Christmas Tree at Athol Bight, and several after meetings, convivials, and with this variety, all members tastes should have been catered for. Thank you Peter and Betty for your effort in 1977. Peter, your Cricket Day with Manly was a classic. The performances on that day by the two Ron's (Atko and Hammond) had to be seen to be believed, as also was Peter's effort in his karate handling of the "Esky". Many thanks to Manly; not to say anything about Jack Jewell's home team decisions would be unfair.






