CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Fellow Members,

Congratulations to all Members for your efforts in 2007.



INCIDENT REVIEW COMMITTEE REPORT

Our local Code of Conduct was developed in 2005, in response to frequent incidents of poor conduct and a lack of transparency and urgency in the process for dealing with them. Part of the process uner the new Code is to refer all incidents to the Incident Review Committee (IRC) to manage a documented and time-bound process. The IRC consists of a representative of the clubs, a representative of the referees (my role), and the Junior League Administrator.

I am pleased to report that the Junior League's Code of Conduct is having a strong and positive influence on the culture of the Game in our district. In 2006 (last year), the IRC had 8 separate incidents to review and to resolve. In 2007 (this year) it had only two.

One of the two incidents this year concerned an encrouching spectator physcially pushing and verbally abusing one of our younger referees. This is clearly a matter that required a documented and time-bound process. It was resolved with a very long ban of the offender from all activities in the Game. This outcome has been widely discussed amongst the various participants in our Game, and sets a highly visible precendent of the consequences of breaking the Code. It should have a strong deterrent effect.

The other incident concerned abuse between club officials and spectators at the conclusion of a match. This also resulted in sanctions against two of the individuals concerned. Again, it provided clear reinforcement of what conduct is unacceptable under the Code.

The main scope for improvement in any future IRC incidents is in timeliness. While all matters were resolved within the season, several loop-holes for delay were conjured up and exploited. Any further incidents require tight management of timing, and under the Code this forms part of the role of the Junior League Adminitrator.

DIRECTOR OF FINANCE REPORT

Mr Chairman and members,

Once again it gives me great pleasure to present to you the financial statements of the Association for the 2007 season. This season was a tough season in terms of the number of games we had to provide referees. The more games we are required to provide referees for means an increase in our revenue base via active member affiliation fees. Unfortunately for our revenue base this year due to six weeks of washouts, our revenue base decreased. The 2007 season saw a decrease of \$47.00 from last year. The washouts did give our active members time to recharge their batteries. Expenditure this year decreased substantially from last season. Our main outlay last year was the purchase of new communications equipment. We are also seeing inventory levels turning over, which decreases our cost of gear sold. Administration expenses have decreased on last year as well. It appears we have a solution to the increasing cost of insurance. This year we have been covered for professional indemnity, public liability and sickness and accident through Gow-Gates Insurance Brokers under the NSW Junior Rugby League scheme. Hopefully this initiative continues this cash saved in future years should be used for the future development of the active members.

The bottom line for the year is a surplus of \$580.16. This is a great position to be in considering we cannot seem to attract sponsorship and we are basically self- sustaining. Sponsorship will continue to be hard to come by considering there is no North Sydney competing in the National Rugby League. The strength of our Association is the balance sheet which shows our net assets as \$11,596.86, which once debtors and creditors have been paid will be represented by cash and inventory.

Looking towards the future, the Association and the in coming board need to devise and implement a financial strategy that will reduce spending and the continued increase in losses relating to our presentation evening. While our net asset position is strong for an Association of our size we need to maintain it. This is due to the fact that rugby league is unfortunately in decline within the North Sydney District. The reason is the gentrification of the area. Any strategy will take time; we do need to plan for the future.

Finally I would like to thank my fellow board members for their continued support throughout the year. Also, congratulation to all members who refereed to such a high standard and did themselves and the Association proud. I look forward to seeing everyone back on the park next year.
