# **PATRON'S REPORT**


It is once again my pleasure to congratulate the Association and it's Executive Officers on the completion of an eventful season, as discussed in this Annual report.

# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Fellow Members,

Without doubt, 2005 was an arduous season for all. But in the end, it was a season of triumph. Our member's efforts on both Grand Final days, from our younger ones who controlled the Mini Gala games right through to the A Grade, were of the highest quality. You are all to be congratulated on a job that was very well done under enormous pressure.

The season was marked by the declining confidence of our members in the Junior League. This was exacerbated when the Junior League failed to hold a meeting for nearly three months and our reports were left in limbo. We are keen to address this falling confidence and since the end of season, we had offered on three occasions to meet with the Junior League. Then, on October 25, a scheduled Judiciary hearing into alleged breaches (dating back to May) of the National Code of Conduct did not take place. Since this date, our members have been unavailable for any appointments. This was not a decision that was taken lightly.

I am pleased to report that on November 22, we met with the Board of the Junior League and that considerable progress was made. The Junior League has agreed to action our concerns prior to the commencement of the next season and we are confident that we will be back on the paddock in April 2006.

To facilitate this, a sub-committee has been formed between our Association and the Junior League to draw up a firm policy toward the implementation of the National Code of Code of Conduct. The Board of the Junior League has agreed to amend their constitution to accommodate this policy. The first meeting of this sub-committee is scheduled for December 6.

During the meeting, it was clearly evident that while we may not always see eye to eye, our common goal is to continue to ensure that the game of Rugby League is always played in North Sydney.

A number of milestones were set during the year, none more so that the adoption of our new constitution. Thanks to the efforts of Tom Peet and Martin Ryan, we have a document that should serve us well in the years to come.

Through the efforts of our Accreditation Providers Stan Watson and Jon Stone, we welcomed a number of new referees Luke Kelso, Nathan Boss, Michael Colla, Peter Florimo and Matt Hanby started their refereeing careers. # **Coaching Report**

I would like to say that by far, season 2005 has been the most successful for the North Sydney Referees Association. I would like to start by expressing my gratitude and saying a very big thank you to a few people. Without those people, this season may not have been as successful as will be indicated in this report.

Firstly I would thank Mr John Quinn for his support throughout the season and for supplying me with the names of a couple of prospective candidates. Those candidates being Matthew Hanby and Peter Florimo that became active during the season.

Mr Quinn also provided the coaching staff with the name of a prospective trainer, who became the official North Sydney Referees Association physical trainer. That trainer being Mr Peter Kirby who is also the North Sydney Premier League trainer. My thanks also goes to Mr Peter Kirby for the time and effort that he put in throughout the season for getting the referees to a good level of fitness and maintaining that level of fitness throughout the season.

I would also like to thank Michael Quailey and Jon Stone for their help throughout the season with the coaching of skills and drills mainly for the junior referees, not forgetting Tom Peet for his expertise in providing Touch Judging skills.

Jon Stone gets an extra mention for his assistance with the accreditation seminars that were conducted throughout the season. This Association had 9 new candidates attend the Accreditation Seminars conducted by the Association. Out of the 9 candidates, 5 candidates became active this season, 2 candidates froze and were a no show while 2 other candidates

will definitely be starters for season 2006, with another 2 candidates awaiting to undergo the Accreditation Seminar next year.

Michael Quailey also gets an extra mention. Michael would bring his laptop to training every Monday evening and have members undergo a Laws Quiz to keep members tuned in to the present Laws of the game. A very big thank you also to Di Chapman and Michael Quailey for the use of their home when the coaching staff were conducting coaching seminars throughout the season.

Thank you to Scot Murray for his assistance in arranging a lecture room with electronic aids for lecturing at the Asquith Leagues Club so that the Accreditation Seminars could be conducted.

Other candidates expressed an interest in becoming referees through the Association's Web Site. Well done Nathan Smith. Thank you also goes out to Peter Kay from the Pennant Hills Football Club for also supplying the name of a prospective candidate, Nathan Boss who also became active toward the end of the season.

Throughout the season, the coaching staff became frustrated due to the fact that some of the skills, drills and Laws of the game that were drilled into the referees were not adhered to by some.

One referee had no control of the players during an U/9's game. At the end of the first 10 minute period, the referee went to the referees changeroom. At this stage, the players from both teams decided that they had had an ample break and decided to start the second period without the referee.

Another referee, whilst controlling an U/13's fixture, saw an attacking team kick the ball high after the fifth play the ball from the defending team's 30 metre line. He watched the ball land in the field of play, bounce into the defending team's ingoal and watched as a defending player grounded the ball in his own ingoal. The referee also ran into the ingoal and after looking at and speaking with the closest touch judge and looking at the far touch judge, took one step backwards and pointed to where the defending player had grounded the ball and blew his whistle long, indicating a try had been scored. No wonder two of the three referees coaches have no or very little hair.

By season 2006, the Association should have another three Level 2 referees amongst its ranks as three members will venture westward to undergo the Level 2 Accreditation Seminar.

I would like to finish by saying that not all of the coaching staff efforts were in vain as could be seen by the appointments that were earned throughout the finals and grand finals. Congratulations to those members that were appointed to officiate at the Grand Finals.

# Treasurer'\$ Report

Mr Chairman and members,

Once again it gives me great pleasure to serve as your Honorary Treasurer for the 2005 season. The season again resulted in deficit. However the Association is still in a sound financial position. Currently the Association is self-sustaining and we should be able to continue in this vain for a number off seasons.

Unfortunately this season again saw the Association was without a sponsor. The 2005 season has been the first in which the Association could not pay our members the match payment that were due by the end of the financial year. The Junior League held onto three months worth of match payments from members. The large debtors and creditors figures in the balance sheets are the accrued amounts receivable from the Junior League and net payments to members.

As you can see by the income and expenditure statement for the 2005 season the Association made a deficit of \$1,308.63. As at 1 July 2005 the Association has voluntarily opted out of the GST system. It has become clear that being in the system was of little benefit to members. It was also a cost to members as the Association would lose money as the GST on match payments to members could not be claimed back through this system.

Revenue for the year increase by \$2,466.01 while expenditure also increased \$1,257.75. There was a write off of gear sold during the year \$410.76. This item of the Association's continues to course problems year after year. During the coming season with a new structure in place, policies for gear and expenditure will need to be drafted to ensure that management of this asset is carefully monitored.

Finally thank you to my fellow committee members for your support throughout the year. I look forward to season 2005 as I look to take a more active role in the participation in the Association.


