

## PATRON'S REPORT



All you have got to do is put in your best and not think you are going to be appointed through default.

To my old friend Bill Lalor - your words of encouragement during the season at certain times helped me through.


To my fellow travel companions - John Boyle and Martin Ryan - to Steve Tulinsky and his social committee - thank you for all your hard work.

## SECRETARY'S REPORT

Fellow Members.

It gives me great pleasure to present to you, the 1991 Annual Report and Balance Sheet. The season just concluded proved to be one of the most difficult in our Association's history. For me personally, it was the most difficult that I have encountered since joining in 1979. Although there were some highlights and achievements, there were also problems and disappointments and it would be remiss of me if all aspects were not covered in the following pages. To consign 1991 to history, one must reflect on all happening so that the mistakes can be learned from and not repeated.

The season started on a disappointing note when, at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting, our nominees to the Junior Representative Squad had to be called before the newly elected Committee. The reason for this was that some (not all) of the Squad had not shown the commitment necessary to be in this squad by not turning up to training. By not turning up without contacting the relevant authority, the members not only placed themselves in a bad light but the Association as well and this is something that cannot be tolerated. These members were soon shown (and accepted) the error of their ways and I am sure that the situation will not be repeated.

After the season started, things appeared to have settled down but then the serious problem of recreational drugs reared its ugly head and the Committee (and the Association) had a delicate but extremely serious problem on its hands. The Committee feels that the matter was handled in a calm and rational manner and that the outcome was beneficial to all parties concerned. While on this subject, the Association owes a debt of gratitude to Ian McCall and the Executive of the NSW Rugby League Referees Association for their guidance and wisdom.

In my last three reports, I have touched on the perennial subject of the abuse that our members receive. I was hoping that 1991 would be free of any incidents in this regard but alas, it was not to be. Abuse from spectators is one thing but when it comes from club officials that is something that is just not on, especially as some of these people should really know better. The matter deteriorated to such an extent that our Committee was forced to seek a meeting with the Executive of the Junior League. Fortunately, the experience and wisdom of these two bodies was enough to sort the problems through and by the end of the season, the situation was all but eliminated from the Official community.

My greatest fear over the last few years was that one of our members would be subject to a physical attack. Alas, this year, my fear was realised and most unfortunate of all, it happened to a Junior Member. To complicate this matter, it did not occur during a Junior League match but in a Monday evening school competition match which is under the direct control of the District Club. The parents of our member (by deciding to not take civil action) placed great faith in the District Club to handle the matter diligently, efficiently and competently. Although we can appreciate that there were some mitigating circumstances and that there were also some legal points which had to be addressed, we do feel that we were let down in this regard as the matter (which occurred in August) was not resolved until mid December.

### SECRETARY'S REPORT

The outcome was that the player in question was suspended for 10 years. The two members who were involved are to be commended for their actions, not only for remaining calm when the event took place but also at the subsequent hearings as well. We trust that the member and his parents can now rest a little easier now that the matter has been finalised.

Another disappointing aspect of the year was the apparent lack of action on the behalf of some of our Sub-Committees. These Committees form an intricate part of the running of the Association as they were set up to take some of the pressure off the main Committee. By being largely inactive, this pressure goes back on to the main Committee and they are saddled with responsibilities they could well do without. This is something that one should bear in mind when standing for any position - if you cannot give a job 100% then don't do it.

Well, now that all that is out of the way, the following pages will highlight our members achievements in 1991. There were some fine appointments at all levels, namely Grade, Junior Reps and Junior League. To all our members who gained that special appointment during the year, congratulations and well done, we are all proud of you. It is fair to say that these appointments were only gained with hard work and dedication. To those who missed out, keep trying and work just that little bit harder and the rewards will come.

Under the guidance of the Guilbert Brothers, our Touch Football team (mainly consisting of Juniors) is performing well again this year. While this sort of activity is good in that it keeps these members fit during the off season, it also allows them to see what a game is like from a playing perspective and hopefully, they will learn from this the next time they run out with a whistle.

1991 was also an extremely difficult year for me personally and without the strength and support of a number of my fellow referees, I doubt that I would have made it through to the end. To Bill Lalor, Colin Jones, John Porteous, Brian Barry and Father Terry Bell, a special thank you to each of you. Also, a special thank you to Bert Cowley, Jim Brannigan (Junior League) and Kevin Nicholls (District Club).

Last, but by no means least, goes the biggest thank you of all to the people who were my "pillars of strength". Brian and Dymphy Minnett, John Boyle, John Quinn and Martin Ryan. Thank you again.

Finally, there was someone else who was there through it all. To Di, thank you, I don't think I could say anymore.

When we look back on 1991, let us not forget the mistakes which were made but remember them. That way we can improve on them and make 1992 a better year for everyone.

I look forward to seeing you all in 1992.





Unfortunately, season 1991 did not pass without our families and friends losing loved ones. Our deepest sympathies are extended to all those who have suffered a bereavement during the past year.


