

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Dear Members,

It gives me great pleasure in presenting the 1998 Annual Report and Financial Statements. 1998 has been a year of significant change for the Association and also for Rugby League. This year saw the beginning of a new era with Rugby league coming back together after a year of division. Again, the Association was left without a major sponsor. As you will see from the financial statements the Association is in a financially sound position.

The start of 1998 saw a change to the committee of the Association. Unfortunately not all positions were filled at the Annual General Meeting. Luckily at the first General meeting of the year all but one position was left unfilled. The Association's strength lies in its cooperation and support of its members. Lets hope this support can be strengthened in the coming season.

The Monday after the Annual General Meeting, a number of our members attended the Annual General Meeting of the District Club. At this meeting 80% of the Club's members passed a resolution to move to the Central Coast as from season 1999.

As usual, 1998 kicked of with the Annual NSW Referees golf day held over the Australia Day weekend. Thank you to Gerard Bailey, our Golf Captain for organising the team.

Representative trials were held again for the District's representative teams. Thank you to those who officiated in them. As most of us know, it is a challenging time of the year to referee.

1998 again saw the number of Junior League teams diminish. This was particularly noticeable in the open age grades where only five positions were available to referee. Again, 1998 saw a joint competition with Manly, this year the competition was extended from U/14s to U/19s to include the U/13s age group. Unfortunately the Manly Junior League again went back on an agreement made at the beginning of the season where, if a North Sydney team finished higher on the competition table than a Manly team, the semi-final and or the Grand Final would be played in North Sydney. This again denied our members of semi-final experience. Hopefully next year an agreement between the two leagues will be set in concrete to avoid another backflip. This will not only be a benefit our members but also an added bonus to the Junior League come finals time.

This year saw the recruitment of a number of Junior Referees to the Association, most of who are footballers within the District. It is pleasing to see them embrace refereeing and the Association with such enthusiasm. The enthusiasm by which these new recruits embraced the Association was evident in the attendance at our final meeting, Life Member's night and the Annual Presentation Dinner. These members are the future of the Association; it is now up to the future committees and senior members to guide them in the right direction.

A number of social events were held throughout the year. These events will be reported in greater detail later in this report. One event that I would like to mention was the Life Member's appreciation night. This night was held after the final general meeting of the year. Unfortunately it could not be held in the same week as the Junior League Grand Finals. I had a fantastic response from a lot of Life Members who all supported the night. What was very disappointing was the non-attendance by the active referees. In a year of reconciliation within the game, it is these events that can bond and strengthen people and also learn from those who have come before us. Special thanks for this event must go to Messrs John Quinn, Monty Hodges of the District Club and Jim Henry of the Leagues Club.

1999 will be an uncertain time in the future of the North Sydney District. With the District Club moving to the Central Coast, the Leagues Club has made the decision to the support of the Junior League in the district. It will now be up to the Leagues Club, the Junior League and this Association to work and plan together for the future of Rugby League in the North Sydney District. The challenge of the new committees of each organisation is to have a vision for the future development of Rugby League in this area.

I would like to thank the following people and organisations for their help throughout this year:


Martin Ryan, Vice President, thank you for your hard work and the many cap's you wore throughout the season. The friendship and support from both you and Mary were invaluable.

JUNIOR LEAGUE REPORT

To say that the last year has been difficult for the Junior League would be an understatement. With the District Club's move to the Central Coast, there was a great deal of uncertainty surrounding all facets of Junior League in this District. Many clubs found it difficult to recruit players because of this uncertainty.

The man charged with the running of the ship was Kevin Nicholls who was appointed as the Junior League Administrator in late 1997. Kevin did an admirable job in the running of the League.

With the dramatic drop in open age fixtures, it was at times difficult to find suitable games for all our members. We were looking at entering an exchange program with Manly but this could not eventuate until we had suitable professional indemnity insurance. This cover has now been arranged so such a venture will be possible next season.

The wet weather played havoc with the scheduling late in the season, especially the semi-finals. Great cooperation from all quarters, clubs Junior League and Referees, ensured that all matches were finally played.

Already plans are well under way for next season. Thanks to North Sydney Leagues Club, the League will survive for 1999 as the Club is funding the League (which includes our match payments).

Open age football will return to Sunday's next season. There may be some games played on Friday nights or Saturday afternoon, but the majority will be played on Sunday.

The joint competition with Many did have its ups and downs. On the up side, we did get more matches throughout the regular season and this helped to a certain extent in covering the loss of open age fixtures. The down was that North Sydney did not host a single semi-final match, even when two North Sydney teams were playing. The lack of post season fixtures was of great concern to me as it was to our Active Members. You can be assured that our feelings were made known to the Junior League on this matter and you can be assured that all avenues will be explored next year to ensure we receive our fair share of the big matches.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Fellow Members,

It gives me great pleasure to submit for your approval, the financial accounts of the Association for the 1998 season.

The main objective for the year was to ensure the financial stability of the Association and I believe this has been achieved.

Before commenting on the results, I would first like to cover some of the initiatives that have been implemented this year.

Firstly, the accounting method. In previous years, the method of accounting used by the Association was a mixture of both the Cash and Accrual methods. This was not satisfactory. I might add that while it was not satisfactory, it is in no way a reflection of previous Treasurers' as they carried out their duties with distinction. This year we moved to purely Accrual accounting.

Secondly, the old paper based journal was dispensed with and the Association's financial records are now kept on a computer ledger. This, I believe was a major step forward and allowed for the timely preparation of data throughout the season for presentation at meetings and simplified the final reconciliation of accounts.

Thirdly, the Association purchased the Commonwealth Bank's Quickline program. Quickline allows for instant access to the Association's Bank records including up to date statements with out the need to visit the Bank. Most importantly, it allowed for the electronic processing of match payments to members and the paying of the Association's other bills direct to a nominated bank account. This had benefits for members and the Association in general. Members received their payments as clear funds in their account without the need to wait for cheques to clear. The Association benefited from a simplifying of the payment process and reduced costs. While the Bank charges for the service (they even changed the fee structure during the year), this cost is more than covered by the savings in other areas such as time, postage and State Government Taxes. While 1998 and 1997 figures for Taxes are comparable, it should noted that the 1997 State Government Taxes figures hardly include any match payments as almost all of 1997 payments were made by cheque in November and December (the current financial year).

Onto our results. You will see that we recorded a loss for the year of \$612-59. While this may appear to be disappointing, some other factors need to be taken into account. Added back onto this figure should be the non-cash expense of the write off of the old gear (\$413-60) and the loss incurred on the 1997 Annual Dinner (and related expenses such as presentations) which was held in November and therefore in the current accounting period (\$971). When these items are added back, we show an underlying surplus of \$772-01 for the year, which is commendable under the circumstances.

The reduction in Junior League games, especially in the open age groups affected our Members and therefore the Association's earning capacity. You will notice a reduction in match income of \$9,581 that equates to reduction in the Association earnings of \$958-10. The fact that we were still able to record an underlying surplus with this dramatic reduction in income is commendable to all members in the ability to keep costs down.

We again suffered through the slow payment of our Match Fees from the District Club throughout the early part of the season. In fact, we were not able to make the April and May payments until the end of August. The was particularly embarrassing for the Association as we were unable to pay for our new gear until these payments had been received, much to the chagrin of the supplier. However, things turned around towards the end of the year and all payments were received to enable the final payment to be made before October 31.

At the time of writing, we are still awaiting the supplemental coaching grant of \$400 from NSWRL Referees. As this is a grant, the amount has not been included in receivables.

Should any member have questions regarding the accounts, the Secretary holds a detailed Profit and Loss statement.

Many thanks to all my fellow committee members for their help and support throughout the year.

Finally, to my wife Di goes the biggest thank you of all. Your help and dedication to my jobs are the only reason I get through.




