


PRESIDENT'S REPORT













SECRETARY'S REPORT






Saturday morning arrived, even though for some Friday night didn't exist. Breakfast was poached eggs and some of the eyes on our ref's resembled the food on our plates.



In tow are David Van Es, Andrew Stokes and Michael Quailey.






