

Director of Finance Report

Mr Chairman and members

It gives me great pleasure to act as your Director of Finance for the 2014 season. The 2014 saw me act as your Treasurer/Finance Director for 13 consecutive seasons. This year saw a slight increase in the number of games our members refereed on Saturdays and Sundays, which put pressure on all members. Unlike previous years we did not require outside assistance from our affiliates. There was an increase in match fees from last season.

The Association again made a loss for the third year in a row. The deficit this year was \$1,699. This year's loss can be explained by the following transaction:

- Additional expenditure on coaching and development above our grant allocation;
- No sponsorship income.

The Association made running repairs to the communications equipment purchased last year. Had this expenditure not been incurred a surplus would have been delivered. This running repair is an investment in our active referees and advisors and we can confidently say the performances of our members on the field vindicated this investment.

Financially we are still in a sound position as virtually a self-sustaining Association. We as an Association need to continue to watch our costs and generate additional income to benefit our members. No one goes broke turning a surplus.

Thank you to Mrs Liz Quailey how acted as a Patron for the season and donated the cost of fitting the new junior referees uniforms.

Thank you to Greg Florimo and Brent Pigram of the Junior League/District Club and Dave Chapple of the Junior League for their support for the season.

Thank you to Jimmy Oliveria of the New South Wales Rugby League Referees' Association for his continued support and interest in our Association and ensuring we are looked after.

Congratulations to two great friends of mine and equally great man of the Association, Stan Watson on being our nominee for the North Sydney Men of League Award and our Chairman Michael Quailey on winning the Dennis Braybrook Award. A great achievement by two great men.

Due to business and family reasons this year is my final year I will serve as your Director of Finance. I have served on the Executive/Board of the Association since returning from overseas at the end of 2001 and I have fulfilled the role of Deputy Chairman since the Board model was enacted. I can say I have served with some very good and capable people as well as others who tried hard. Thank you for the privilege to serve this great Association as a board member.

Finally I would like to thank the ladies in my life, Claire and Georgia. Thank you to my fellow board members for the year.

Director of Referee Development's Report

The main focus for season 2014 in terms of referee development was to build the competence and confidence of the junior referees to equip them to deal with the challenges of refereeing rugby league in a tough and demanding environment. We spent a great deal of time working on improving our knowledge of the laws of the game and the practical application of the laws in various game situations. There was a noticeable improvement throughout the season in the general knowledge of the laws of the game as a result of regular coaching and some very generous input from our graded members, Jon Stone, Scott Murray, Nathan Smith and Steve Clark. There is no doubt that this gave many of our active referees a renewed confidence in themselves and their ability to referee in tight and stressful situations.

Our training sessions and seminars were well attended this year. We were very fortunate to have our graded members and a number of former graded members attend and contribute to our development through the training and seminars. Of particular interest was the input we received from Greg Florimo when he talked to us about the expectations that players and officials have of referees. This was a refreshing perspective and was well received by all our referees.

Fitness is always an issue for referees. The game is getting faster and faster every year. Coaches are always looking for ways to advance the ball down the field as quickly as possible. Consequently today's referees need to be in peak condition in order to contribute to a free flowing and entertaining game. As a group, the level of fitness of the active referees in North Sydney is excellent. The fact that many of our referees are current or ex-players contributed to an enthusiastic approach to training and fitness. Once the season got into full swing, a number of individual referees recognised the need for improved fitness and it was great to see so many of them turning up for training on Monday nights with this goal in mind.

All our new members have now discovered that they are on a very steep learning curve. They all embarked on an intensive study of the laws of the game which was only the first step in their first year of what we hope will be a long and successful refereeing career. Without exception, every one of our new referees developed their skills and knowledge during the season and demonstrated a significant improvement from their first games at the start of the season. They learned about the practical application of the laws under the watchful eye of the various association coaches.

Colin Jones' patience and experience was appreciated by all the active referees who benefited from his sage advice throughout the year. Colin also contributed significantly to training sessions on Monday nights, generously sharing the knowledge and wisdom he gained from many years of experience at the highest level.

As always, Stan Watson was a major influence on the development of all our active referees this season. The new referees were particularly lucky to have been coached by Stan through the practical component of their level 1 course at the start of the year. Stan's approach to coaching all of us throughout the season created an atmosphere of continuous collaborative learning. His knowledge of the game and his experience working in the NRL environment has been of great benefit to the whole association.

Director of Referee Development's Report (continued)

North Sydney has a wealth of talent in terms of referee coaches. The following members were active as coaches this season: Wayne Edwards, Colin Jones, Stan Watson, Michael Haynes, Jon Stone, Scott Murray, Michael Quailey, and Graeme Field. The collective wisdom of this group of coaches and advisers is significant.

We can be sure that there are not many associations who could boast such a well-qualified and experienced *active* panel of coaches and advisers. Among that group are people with Test Match, State of Origin, and vast NRL experience. Having three active NRL graded members assist with coaching our referees this year means that our young referees have access to the best advice and some high quality and worthy role models.

Their efforts have been richly rewarded with a noticeable improvement in the standard of the refereeing in North Sydney. This was very evident during the semi-final and finals series. All coaches reported that match officials performed at and above expectations. Thank you again to the coaches and congratulations to the referees who have performed so well. Particular thanks to Colin, Stan and Michael Quailey who regularly gave up their weekends to assist us.

Retention of referees is a priority now more than ever. Over the years we have seen many promising referees quit because of the constant pressure and abuse levelled at them from players, coaches, officials, parents and spectators. As an association we have attempted to equip our referees to deal with the stress, pressure and abuse. We have also defended our referees and attempted to protect them from abuse and inappropriate criticism from other stakeholders. Unfortunately, when the junior league is unable or unwilling to impose suitable sanctions to offenders, we are always going to have a battle to retain our promising young referees.

There were a number of incidents this season where referees were subjected to abuse and most were dealt with appropriately. We expressed our concern over an ugly incident where a club official openly and blatantly abused a referee during a game in full view and hearing of junior players and parents, yet only received a suspended sentence - a mere slap on the wrist and an insult to the referees who expose themselves to this every week.

In the interests of referee development, we will continue to take a stand against such disgraceful behaviour and all referees are encouraged to continue to set the bar high in regard to their expectations of behaviour of players, officials and spectators, and their adherence to the code of conduct. We will set is as a goal for 2015 to establish a common understanding of the expectations regarding the code of conduct and the procedures for referees to follow in the event of breaches of the code of conduct.

There was a marked improvement in the presentation of our active referees in 2014. In years now long past, our beloved president, Mr John Quinn used to invoke that now well-worn truism, "If you can't be a good referee, at least look like one!" Many of our active referees were able to live true to this creed and so benefited by gaining respect simply by being well presented and looking like they knew what they were doing. We will continue to develop this most important aspect of refereeing into the future.

Director of Referee Development's Report (continued)

In terms of achievements in 2014 we saw Michael Colla gain appointments in the Junior Representative fixtures. He was also appointed as Stand-by Touch Judge in a number of Holden Cup fixtures. This is a wonderful acknowledgement of his talents. There is no doubt that Michael is continuing to develop into an excellent referee. The hard work he has put into training is paying dividends.

There are other referees in our current ranks who have potential to go down this track also. In particular, Sam Morgan and Dylan Guptill have demonstrated potential to progress further. They have been selected to attend an emerging talent squad training program to be held in early December 2014. This is a great opportunity to get a taste of what it is required in order to succeed at the highest level of refereeing rugby league. We wish both these young men all the very best with their participation in this new initiative of NSW Rugby League.

In all, 2014 was a tremendous year for our referees. Every referee improved. Every referee developed new skills. Every referee honed old skills. We now have a very solid core group of referees, who although quite young, are all extremely competent in refereeing at various levels. Our challenge now is to further develop those who wish to pursue refereeing as a career and to give all referees opportunities to enjoy this great game of rugby league at whatever level they are comfortable with. Thank you to everyone who contributed to this wonderful season and we hope to see every one of you back in 2015.



The junior league is in the process of taking steps to try and ease the loss of players, and an upcoming summit to discuss the state of the game in North Sydney should provide an excellent forum for discussion on how the clubs can best manage existing players and go about attracting new players in the future. This summit will continue what has been a season long discussion amongst members at each junior league meeting.

This season also saw the junior league take a tough stance on code of conduct related matters. From the perspective of the referee's association it is comforting to know that we have a junior league that is willing to back us up and take a hard line approach to dealing with issues such as referee abuse. As the competition got tighter and the finals came around there were a few issues in this area and these matters were dealt with appropriately.

Many thanks must go to Greg Florimo, Dave Chapple and Brent Pigram for their tireless efforts on the board of the junior league this season.
