

# Patrons Report

Gentlemen.

It is once again our privilege to write this short foreword to the Annual Report of the North Sydney District Rugby League Referees Association. In so doing, we are pleased to be able to congratulate the Association and in particular its executive officers on yet another successful season.

In recent years there has been speculation at the commencement of each season as to whether the Association will be able to fulfil its commitments to the Junior League and Schoolboys Association. That as far it has been able to do so in spite of increasing problems is a tribute to the diligence of its officers and the dedication of all members.

The major problem facing the Association and indeed all Junior Associations, with a few exceptions, is that associated with recruitment of new members and the retention not only of new recruits, but also some older members. The task has been made difficult for a number of reasons, some associated with changes in life style and use of leisure time, but it is becoming increasingly apparent that a major contributing factor is the continued denigration of referees, both collectively and individually, not only by some media personnel, but, regrettably, by some players and officials.

We hope that 1979 will see some improvement in this regard.

Perhaps a first step would be the recognition by each of the parties involved that all have an important role to play in the interests of Rugby League and that each individual, be he journalist, commentator, official player, club supporter or referee, carries out his part to the best of his ability.

# Secretary's Report

Again, it is my pleasure to present the 1978 Annual Report. This season has been the most productive yet, with ten new referees joining our ranks. There are also a couple more waiting till this season to join. Also, two junior members gained their Senior ticket.

We decided to hold a full scale seminar for our referees early in the season and we feel this must have helped, whether in a big or small way, everyone that came. It was a great success, first on the refereeing side and then on the social side.

We wish to thank Keith Page, Frank Walsh, Bill Grono, Brian Barry, Alex Soane, Jack Jewell and Bert Cowley for lending their experience.

The weather had been pretty bad prior to the Seminar Day, so Brother Habermann was kind enough (with the aid of the Principal) to lend us St. Leo's College Staffroom and kitchen, where we had an indoor barbeque. My thanks to Ron and Gwen Hammond, Jan Warner and my wife Dymphy for the cooking.

The Annual Referees Touch Football Knock Out competition was hosted by Manly. Our team did very well, just missing out on the semis, but our Deputy Delegate N.S.W. Referees proved to be pretty fast among fast company.

Midway through the season, we had a visiting referee from New Zealand. Mr. Peter Gilmour was on a business trip to Sydney and was appointed to games at Primrose Park. The games went reasonably well, but he had extreme difficulties in coping when he was dined and wined by the executive at the North Sydney Leagues Club later. Before dinner, Mr. Bert Cowley invited us all down to the Board Room for some drinks. Boy, is he heavy on the liquer and light on mixers (if you know what I mean). Pretty mean Barman. It proved devastating for all. Thanks Bert for showing our visitor the hospitality of North Sydney.

This season saw a change in the payment of referees fees. After considerable research into the matter by a subcommittee elected for this purpose, we proposed a different method of vouchers and, as a result, a different way of payment by the Leagues Club and Football Club. This has, we feel, saved the Junior League and Schoolboys Association a lot of time and effort during the season. Continual review of this system will result in new methods being applied, when appropriate.

While on the subject of research, a committee also has been updating the Constitution, a job that has taken a lot of time and thought. It will be put before you at this Annual General Meeting.

The disappointment of the year was the Schoolboys Picnic. It was held at Flat Rock this year (fortunately it didn't rain). The roll-up was exceptional OF REFEREES (both junior and senior), but the roll up of boys!!! (schoolboys) was down again on previous years. The whole set-up will need a lot of thought if it is to be continued. Personally, I feel the behaviour of the boys during the entertainment, in particular, left a lot to be desired.

At the present time the Golf Committee is working frantically to host this year's Annual Golf Day, which will be held on Monday, 29th January (long weekend) at North Ryde Golf Club. Norths are having their best roll-up with eleven players. We feel assured of a most successful day, as approximately 108 players will be competing from 14 Associations.

The Annual Touch Football Knock Out competition will be hosted by St. George at Yagoona the following week. Training by our fellows for this has been under way for several weeks now and this is a way of getting fit for the coming season.

I am very pleased to have been elected Director of Coaching. This is a job I particularly like and I feel it is a very important job.

I would like to thank my fellow executive members, Stephen Betts, John Byrne, Ron Atkinson, John Porteous, Erle Carroll and Ron Hammond for their help and support and of course to John Quinn for his guiding hand during the season. Also to my wife Dymphy for the long hours she has put in to help me.

Lastly, I would like to thank everyone connected with my Life Membership and Presentation. I think everybody that knows me would also appreciate that I like to do all I can, I get a lot of joy out of doing these things and I do not need thanks. 






