At the time of writing this report, I have been informed that the first female has been invited to attend the Pre-Season Representative Seminar. That, of course, is our Skye Edwards. I know we wish her the very best of luck and hope this is only the beginning for her.

Unfortunately, our year was clouded by the passing of one of our most respected Life Members - Bert Cowley. By the way, up until he became too sick to get out, he still came to grounds to report on referees. I know John will mention more about Bert in his Report. To Joyce and family - our thoughts will always be with you.

And then came 'Super League' - with it came out the emotions - verbally and physically and, as on most occasions, the referees lost out. I say this because as far as grade was concerned, referees who signed with Super League were stood down (players weren't only the representative ones) A far as this Association was concerned, we were in the situation of having a member (Jim Neal) who was no longer refereeing in grade, but in effect was helping to coach referees - active only when needed (in emergencies). We were told by the District Club that it was not in the best interest for him to continue holding any position (Junior League Appointment Board) or refereeing with North Sydney. This led to my argument with the District Club and the Junior League that they have the right without valid or written reason to take a bonofide referee off the "Referees to be Appointed List'. As I said earlier, emotions ran high Our own active members did not mind, but some senior members voiced their disapproval. I don't, and I'm sure most of you don't, begrudge a person bettering one's self as long as it does not interfere with their present duties, and they didn't. Jim Neal did his job as usual, although he was very disappointed at the District Club's attitude. Jim has always done this Association proud, in particular with his attitude to teaching our young referees.

Without dwelling on this too long, I believe Super League is not for the benefit of the game of Rugby League - it is just who can pay the highest fees. I am sure referees should have been paid more in the past and maybe they have gained one thing out of this - that of being better looked after, but what a price to pay.

The game of Rugby League and the many people who help, do so for the love of it.

Next season the new levels of gaining a referees ticket will come into force. By present indications, it is going to be difficult at first and will probably need more coaching staff to implement it.

Another date to remember is our 75th Anniversary in one year's time. This will need a lot of work and I know John will mention this at greater length.

The Competition was a mixed bag, with a number odd age groups unable to field competitions in this district. It created a few problems, but we overcame them.

To all referees who participated in Finals etc - my congratulations. To David Lombardo, our shortest and youngest referee to do an A Grade Grand Final and did it exceptionally well - it was well deserved. I've always had a dig at David's height, but it has always been harmless - he has a big heart and has worked hard to get where he is. The Board had no hesitation in appointing him to this fixture. He has great future.

This Association is blessed with a wonderful and talented group of young and not-so-young referees. They get on well together, with few exceptions, and I am pleased to call all of them "my friends". This is the depth of this Association - enjoyment, friendship and just plain good company.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Dear Members,

It is with great pleasure I present to you, the 1995 Annual Report and Balance Sheet. In this report I have tried to compile an accurate reflection of the state of the Association. Unfortunately, as like last year the Association was left without a major sponsor but as you will see from the Balance Sheet later in the report the Association is financially sound.

The year got off to a flying start with the Annual NSW Referees Golf Day over the Australia Day Holiday. First off it would be remiss of me not to congratulate Canterbury Referees Association on winning the Main Trophy. Also thanks should be given to our Golf Captain, Stephen Clark, for his hard work in getting a team together.

As has been the practice over the last few years the on-field side of refereeing started early this year with Representative Trials held at Macquarie University. Thank you to all the referees who made themselves available, especially considering the weather factors.

1995 again saw North Sydney Junior League have a fall in the amount of sides competing in the age groups U/7's to U/19's. This caused the Junior League in the age groups U/16's to U/19's to send the sides down to play in the Manly area. This left on every 2nd or 3rd Sunday only 12 to 15 Games for our referees to do. This unfortunately meant some referees had to miss out on a centre, but on the bright side led to more active competition and I believe and improvement in standard of our referees. This and the measures brought in by the coaching panel with the help of the Appointments Board helped to build a stronger Association.

Unfortunately 1995 saw the Association and the Refereeing world in general lose a number of good friends. One of those friends was a Life Member of our Association, Bert Cowley. Bert, for some of our Junior Members, was one of our members who had risen from the ranks and through hard work got graded. Bert, as some of our Grade and Active Members will tell you, never forgot the Association and was rewarded by the Association with Life Membership in 1959. Bert also worked hard in both the Junior League and District Club circles where for a number of years he was the Schoolboy Association President. As an up incoming young referee I remember many a time being hauled over the hot coals and being fined for not having my vouchers correct. (Isn't life easier now that the Association does all the claims.) Bert worked hard helping the younger referees with their skills and their careers. Many an older referee will remember Bert down at Primrose Park helping out the juniors at a referee's coaching seminar and up to only few years ago not only was he seen writing reports on active referees for the Appointments Board but was rules adviser for the District Club. He will be sorely missed. The Association in recognition of Bert's work, unanimously, decided to change the name of our Special Achievement Award to the Bert Cowley Achievement Award.

I will say very few words about 'Super League' in my report, as Brian in his report has summed up not only his own feelings but the opinion of a number of our members. It was very disappointing that the Junior League and District Club took the stance that they did and as usual the referees were left out in the cold. It also should be said that at no time did Jim Neal or Stephen Clark act in any way contrary to Constitution and Rules governing our Association, and as a matter of fact Jim and Stephen always kept the Executive advised on any issue they thought could effect our Association.

This year saw the Association hold a number of Social Events which are written in more detail later in the report, but I believe one should be mentioned here. The Annual Dinner meeting, where we saw Father Terry Bell presented the first Bert Cowley Achievement Award for services to our Association. Terry has been a friend and great support to many of our members over the years he has been with the Association and this recognition is well deserved.

1995 also saw the advent of National Accreditation Scheme for referees. This scheme from Level One to Five will help with the training and development of referees into the 90's and beyond. It also brings in line Rugby League Refereeing with other sports with its recognition by the Australian Sports Commission. At this time the Coaching panel and Executive are looking into bringing in a On Field Management Plan for the future to help with coordinating the accreditation scheme, to help with the recruitment and preparation of new referees and to continue the skills development, fitness training and assessment of existing active referees.

1996 sees us planning for the 75th Anniversary of our Association in 1997. A lot of work has to be done. As you see from our Office Bearers and Committees a committee has been formed to help with the planning of this special year. Please do not just leave it to that committee, all help will be greatly appreciated.

At this time I would like to thank a few people and organisations for their help throughout this year and proceeding ones:

To Malcolm Woodcock, Wayne Lambkin and the Board of Management of the Junior League, congratulations on the completion of a successful year.

To Ian McCall, Les Mathews and the Executive of the NSW Referees Association thank you for your support and assistance throughout the year.

On a personal note this year has been very busy but rewarding year for me personally and as your Secretary, topped off by being awarded the Bob Purcell Trophy. It has been a lot easier with the help of a very supportive Executive:

To my wife, Karen, thank you for being there to listen and support me.



TREASURERS REPORT

It has been a pleasure to once again serve as Treasurer of the Association.

Unfortunately, another year has passed without any form of Sponsorship and this has again resulted in referees having to purchase all their own gear.

For the first time in a number of years we didn't receive any assistance from the NSW Referees Association via their major sponsor TNT. During the past seasons we have received a grant of \$600.00 plus reimbursement of Coaching expenses also up to \$600.00. 


