To our 10 new Juniors, thanks for accepting the challenge of refereeing. I enjoyed seeing you all take your first steps into our challenging but rewarding role. You all laid a great foundation and should be able to build on that in 2019.

In addition to our new recruits, Sam Shiel was able to help from time to time as his indoor cricket commitments permitted and Nathan Guptill returned in June following his army experience.

To all who took the field for the first time or returned, thank you for your services. Hopefully in 2019 we can build on what you achieved in 2018.

All eight were valuable additions to our ranks, each providing a different level of experience. We thank you for coming on board and we hope that you thoroughly enjoyed yourselves and that you will be with us for many years to come.

Still of concern is the continuing decline in the grades that are played on Sundays. This was the second year for Conference competitions with the addition of Under 20s (to replace Under 19s) and Under 18s. The Under 16s and 17s and A Grade played in a "Northern Conference" consisting of North Sydney, Manly Warringah and Balmain while with the Under 20s and Under 18s played in a Sydney Wide Conference, split into Gold and Silver divisions. This trend does not bode well for the future of our game. The NSWRL's decision to continue with the Sydney Shield will only continue to erode the quality of A Grade "Park Footy".

Todd Smith resigned from his role as co-ordinator of the Northern Conference competitions to concentrate on his refereeing in the NRL. To Todd we thank you for your commitment and dedication and wish you well for the future. He has already had a few NRL appointments so a permanent spot in the top grade cannot be too far away.

Towards the end of the season, Ben James took over Todd's role. We welcomed Ben to our August meeting and we look forward to working with him in 2019.



One of the benefits of the Sunday competitions is that our members who ran on Sundays were exposed to (in most cases) a better quality of footy to referee and Touch Judge and this was reflected in their on-field performances. Notwithstanding the greater distances to travel, I am sure our members appreciated this aspect.

2018 was the second year of our "Pooling" our Sunday resources with Manly. This continues to be a positive for all, both on and off the field. A big thank you to Shame Charman and the Manly members.

Running on both days, he was a benefit not only on the field but also off it with his help and support to our young referees. One of the few people I have met who thinks 23 degrees is cold weather, he has always put up his hand up to help where and whenever he could. George has indicated that he will be working on one of the remotest places in Australia, Groote Eylandt. While circumstances may see him visit us from time to time, we wish him well. It was great that we could send him off in a year that NSW won the State of Origin.

8) Director of Finance Report

Mr Chairman I'm very happy to present the accounts to the Board and members and to have served as the Director of Finance once again. For the second year running I'm glad to report that it has been a successful financial year for the Association as we build towards our 100th anniversary celebrations. This year continued support from our sponsors enabled us, for the first time in many years to purchase training gear. We were light on numbers for the seasons start which severely impacted the number of appointments. However, number picked up throughout the season with new and old faces joining the ranks. This didn't make for the reduced number at the seasons start and has led to a sizable decrease in match fees.

R&H Hornby and Fort Knox returned as sponsors and were joined by All Aspects Group and Travel Manager. These sponsors combined with our major sponsor Elite Golf Turramurra to provide \$4,200 in sponsorship this year. The other main contribution to our income this year was the charity golf day. The other standout expenses this year was the National Primary Games held in Tamworth. With the aid of the coaching and development grant we were able to send three referees and a coach. The remaining expense account are very much in line with previous years.

I would like to thank our Patron Liz Quailey for her continued support of Junior Referees in North Sydney. This year due to her generous donation covered the cost of their gear.

This is my fourth year labouring over the accounts and last year I said that I was finally starting to understand the finer points of accounting. The same is true of this year. With Mr Quailey's guidance and a firm grasp of the accounting equation, the debits and the credits are all adding up. I would like to thank the board and the members for a delightful season and I look forward to seeing everybody next season.


