PATRONS REPORT

Gentlemen.

It is once again our pleasure to comment on the past season and offering some advice on the future.

During the season a new and very successful innovation was offered to the active members by your committee of a lecture and practical instruction held at Primrose Park on a Sunday morning.

The session was attended by a number of grade referees, Head Body Advisory Board members and other officials. From the comment of these people, you can be assured that a number of other associations will be implementing this a MOR procedure during the coming season.

Along with other associations in the metropolitan area, we must be concerned about the growing decline in the number of active members. Fortunately we have, to date, been able to meet all commitments but only with increasing difficulty, and by, at times, imposing an unreasonable burden on willing members. In other areas the crisis point has already been reached and one association, at least, has indicated that the future of the competition in which its members officiate is in jeopardy if membership is not increased. This is a matter which concerns not only Referees' Associations, but all connected with the game in the Sydney area and there must be a thorough investigation of the reasons for the general shortage of referees and the formulation of a plan to attract recruits. It seems obvious that one factor inhibiting persons who might otherwise join our ranks is the persistent denigration of referees, not only by sections of the media and spectators but, regrettably, by some players and officials. No better evidence in support of this conclusion can be offered than the disgraceful incidents which occurred at North Sydney Oval after the final of the 1976 A grade premiership competition. If the ranks of referees are to be maintained even at current levels, it behoves all charged with the responsibility for the conduct and future welfare of the game to ensure that men are encouraged to take up refereeing and that persons who engage in activities which would have the reverse effect should be dealt with in such a manner as will provide a deterrent to others who might be similarly inclined. domes . 9 . 18


